# SPECIAL REGULATIONS FOR THE JUNIOR HOMECRAFTS SECTIONS

- 1. Entries close Friday November 17<sup>th</sup> 2023.
- PLEASE NOTE: All homecrafts entries need to be delivered to the relevant pavilion between 10 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> November. No exhibit will be accepted after noon.
- 3. Judging will commence at 2 p.m. sharp.
- 4. For each exhibit entered the exhibitor will receive a section ticket with the Section, Class and Exhibit number for that item.

Section = overall group of exhibits

Class = specific exhibits in that section

Exhibit number = number allocated to your exhibit

- 5. Section tickets must be firmly attached to the exhibit; staples or straight pins are to be used. No names or markings are allowed on exhibits.
- 6. No exhibit will be released before 3 p.m. on Show Day and a steward must be in attendance when collecting exhibits. Prize money may be collected after 3 p.m.
- NOVICE Not to have won a first prize, in any agricultural show in that class. (A win in a novice class does not prevent entry.)
- 8. The Committee reserves the right to alter, delete from or add to this schedule as circumstances arise.
- 9. The Committee reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry without giving reasons for so doing.
- 10. No judge shall be an exhibitor in that Section in which he/she is judging.
- 11. Exhibitors in all sections must strictly adhere to the instructions of the stewards as to the placing of exhibits. Any decoration, prize card or ribbon from any other show prior to judging will cause disqualification of the exhibit.
- 12. Stewards have the right to re-classify an exhibit if it is obviously entered in the wrong class.
- 13. The judge's decision will be final. No protest regarding an exhibit or a judge's decision will be entertained unless made in writing and lodged with the Secretary within one hour of judging, together with \$50, which will be forfeited if the protest is considered frivolous.
- 14. Judges may award a second prize or may withhold any prize altogether where there is only one exhibitor or where the exhibits are not deemed worthy of prizes.
- 15. Specific information can be found at the head of each section.
- 16. Online entries www.daylesfordshow.com
- 17. **Postal entries using form in this schedule.** Please post entries early to the address on the entry form and include a **stamped, self-addressed envelope**. This ensures acceptance of entries and prompt return of section tickets. Please include all relevant information. Ensure the correct entry fee is included.
- 18. For children under 18 there is no fee to enter any junior competitions.
- 19. Aggregate points in Homecrafts sections: 1st 5 points, 2nd – 3 points. In the event of a tie, the person

awarded the highest number of first prizes will be the winner. The prize is a rosette.

- 20. **MIDLANDS GROUP COMPETITIONS** Winners of classes in bold and marked \*\* are eligible to represent Daylesford in the Midlands Group competitions. First prize is \$10. In the case of cookery and flowers winners will be required to present another exhibit to the Group dinner in March 2024. Other exhibitors may use the same exhibit as they used at Daylesford.
- 21. Please note not all Midlands Group competitions are also VAS competitions. See Section O for a list of VAS competitions.
- 22. VAS COMPETITIONS Only first place winners of exhibits entered in the VAS competitions in Section II – Junior cookery, classes 17 and 18, and Section O go on to the Midlands Group and then to the State final at the Melbourne Royal in September 2024.

#### Recipe

#### Ingredients:

- 375 g mixed fruit
- ¾ cup brown sugar
- 1 tsp mixed spice
- ½ cup water
- 125 g butter
- ½ tsp bicarbonate soda
- ½ cup sherry
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
- 2 tbsp marmalade
- 1 cup self-raising flour
  1 cup plain flour
- 1 cup plain i
   ¼ tsp salt.

#### Method

Place the mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil.

Simmer gently for three minutes, then remove from the stove, add bicarb soda and allow to cool. Add the sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well.

Fold in the sifted dry ingredients, then place in a greased and lined 20 cm round cake tin.

Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1% hours or until cooked when tested.

Recipe

- 2 ½ cups self-raising flour
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- ¼ tsp ground nutmeg
- 1 cup brown sugar (firmly packed)
- 1/3 cup pitted dates
- 1 cup coarsely grated carrot
- 1 tbsp orange marmalade
- 1 cup canola oil
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
- ¾ cup orange juice
- 1 cup reduced fat milk

#### Method

Pre-heat oven to 190c (moderately hot).

Line and spray a 12-hole muffin pan with round paper muffin cases. Classic white muffin cases size (35mm height x 90mm wide x 50mm base).

Sift dry ingredients into a large bowl; stir in dates and carrots. Then add the combined marmalade, oil, eggs, juice and milk. Mix until just combined.

Spoon mixture evenly into prepared pan holes.

Cook for 20 minutes. To test if muffins are cooked, insert a cake skewer; if it comes out clean the muffins are ready.

Stand muffins in the pan for 5 minutes then turn out onto a wire rack to cool. Show entries: Four (4) muffins per plate.

### **Rules & Regulations - Junior Show Ambassador**

- Open to ambassadors aged between 16 and 19 years on the day of their Local Show.
- Each Show can run a Junior Show Ambassador Show qualifier and the winner at Show Level then represents the Show at the Group Final.
- An ambassador having won at their Local Show Level is not eligible to enter any other Show or represent another group.
- The winner of the Group Final then represents the Group at the State Final, which is held at the annual VAS Convention.
- Each Finalist will be judged based on the criteria below.
- At the State Final the Finalists will need to provide a cover letter and resume that will be given to the judges.
- Each Finalist will be interviewed by a panel of three judges and the winner will be announced at the Convention Dinner.

### **Judging Criteria**

- Local Show Involvement (15 Points) Entrants must demonstrate an active involvement and a desire to be involved in the future and improvement of their Local Show Society.
- **Community Involvement (10 Points)** Entrants must demonstrate an active involvement and a desire to be involved in the future and improvement of their Local Community.
- General and Rural Knowledge (15 Points) Entrants must demonstrate a broad general knowledge and an awareness of Local/National Community issues. Entrant must also have an understanding of current affairs relating to rural life and industry.
- **Personality and Confidence (10 Points)** Personality Traits consistent with both the awards and the entrant's ambitions and goals will be assessed (e.g. enthusiasm, creativity, confidence, leadership).
- Ambitions/Goals (20 Points) Each Entrant's ambitions and goals will be assessed on their integrity and relevance to the awards. Entrants must demonstrate steps towards achieving their goal.
- **Communication Skills (20 Points)** Entrants are expected to demonstrate effective communication skills written, oral and interpersonal.
- **Presentation and Grooming (10 Points)** Entrant's presentation will be assessed according to the suitability of their attire and conduct in a range of contexts.

- Winner: \$500 Prizemoney & VAS State Final Trophy
- Runner Up: \$250 Prizemoney
- **Finalist:** Each Group winner receives a travel allowance towards the cost of attending the State Final.
